英語習得時間について

「日本人は、中学、高校と6年間も勉強しているのになぜ英語ができないのか」と言 われて久しいですが、果たして「6年間も」という表現は適切でしょうか。という のも英語習得には約3000時間が必要と言われていますが、日本人の英語学習時間 は塾などを除くと中学、高校で1000時間超に過ぎないからです(最近では小学校 から英語に触れる機会が増えました)。仮に一日5時間の英語学習を毎日続けたとし ましょう。この 1000 時間は 200 日、英語習得に必要な 3000 時間は 600 日 (2 年か かりません)しかありません。つまり、6年間における日本人の英語学習時間は圧 倒的に足りないのです。もちろん、日本人の英語力不足の要因は、これまでの英語 教育が文法中心であり、インプットに比べてアウトプットが極端に不足していると いう側面も大きいのですが、英語力をしっかり身につけるには、普段からもっと英 語に触れる機会を増やす必要があるということです。

英語圏の大学だけでなく、EUや東南アジアの大学における多くの講義は、英語で 行われていることを知っていますか?現在、世界では、高等教育は英語で受けると いうのがグローバルスタンダードになりつつあります。日本でも近年、全講義を英 語で行う大学・学部が増えてきましたが、決して多いとは言えません。いまだ希少 な存在です。その理由は、日本で英語で講義を行うことができる教授が少ないこと と講義を受ける学生の英語力不足にあると言っても過言ではありません(英語で講 義を受けるには、最低でも TOEFL 80 が必要)。母語である日本語で大学の講義を 受け、知識・教養を身につけることができることは、確かに大きなアドバンテージ です。しかし、現在、最先端研究の多くは英語で行われ、英語で発表され、様々な 国の人たちによって英語で議論されています。これらの研究を日本語に訳し、訳さ れた日本語を英語に訳していては、世界の潮流から遅れてしまいます。
